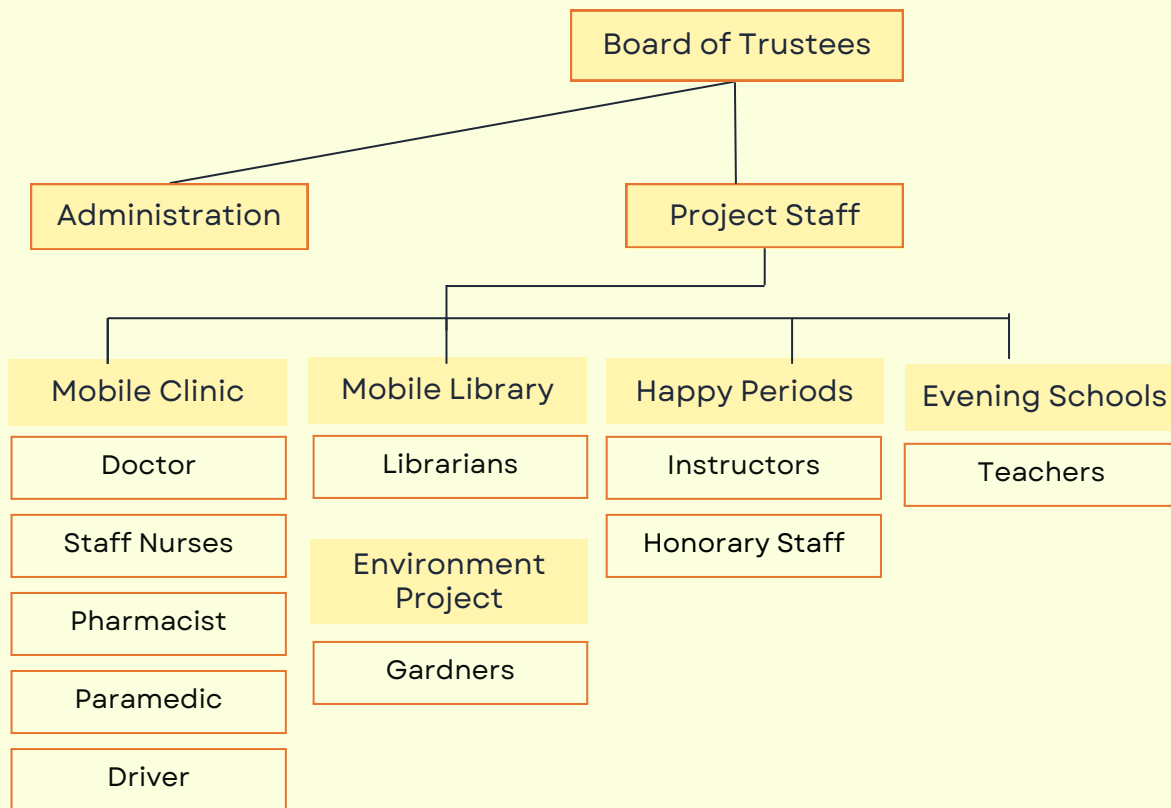
Income Tax Registration Information:

- Regenboog India Foundation is registered under Section 12AA of the Income Tax Act with registration number AABTR1335A25CH01, valid until AY 2036-37.
- The foundation is also registered for Income Tax exemption under Section 80G of the Income Tax Act. Donations to Regenboog India Foundation are eligible for tax deductions under Section 80G, with registration number AABTR1335A24CH01.
- The renewal for this 80G approval has been applied for, and the foundation is awaiting new approval for the period AY 2026-2027.
- The organization also holds valid PAN and TAN numbers.

Other permissions:

- Regenboog India Foundation is registered under the Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (FCRA) of 1974 to receive donations from abroad for our projects. Our FCRA Registration number is 076080146, effective from 01.01.2022 and valid until 31.12.2026.
- Mobile Clinic registered under the Tamilnadu Clinical Establishment Act and the registration number is TVMIAL20240036545, valid till 27-10-2029.

Purpose and Passion

Objectives of Our Organization

1

To establish, develop, maintain and grant aid in cash or in kind to hospitals, medical schools, medical colleges, nursing institutions, dispensaries, maternity homes, child welfare centers and/or such other similar charitable institutions in India for the benefit and use of the general public.

2

To establish, run, support and grant aid or other financial assistance to schools, special schools for disables & mentally challenged, colleges, libraries, reading rooms, universities, laboratories, research and other institutions of the like nature in India, for use of the students and the staff and also for the development and advancement of education and diffusion of knowledge amongst the public in general.

3

To establish, maintain and run studentships, scholarships and render other kind of aid to students including supply of books, stipends, medals and other incentives to study, without any distinction as to caste colour, race, creed or sex.

4

To provide formal or non – formal education for all children and adults without any distinction of caste, creed, color or community or religion.

5

To promote, establish, support, maintain or grant aid to institutions for the promotion of science, literature, music, drama and fine arts, for the preservation of historical monuments and for the research and other institutions, in India, having similar objects for the benefit of the public in general.

6

To establish, maintain or grant aid to vocational training centers for the economically backward.

7

To establish, maintain or grant aid to any project or program which is the public charitable or educational purposes.

8

To establish, maintain or grant aid for the establishment and/or maintenance of parks, gardens, gymnasiums, sports clubs, dharamshalas and rest houses, for use by public in general.

9

To establish, maintain or grant aid to special homes for the aged, destitute children, orphanages, children with AIDS, street children, helpless women in poor economic conditions or other establishments for the relief and help to the poor, needy and destitute people, orphans, widows and aged persons.

10

To establish and develop institutions and special programs to help the physically handicapped and disabled or mentally retarded persons and to provide them education, food, clothing or other essential help.

11

To grant relief and assistance to the needy victims during natural calamities such as famine, earthquake, flood, fire, pestilence, etc. and to give donations and other assistance to institutions, establishments or persons engaged in such relief work.

To establish, maintain or grant aid to street children welfare program or projects.

To establish, maintain or grant aid to project for the farmers and poor village agricultural workers to improve their socio economic status through various awareness programs & special programs.

Beneficiaries - Mapping Impacts

Mobile Medical Clinic

The beneficiaries of the mobile medical clinic project reside in the remote villages of the Tiruvannamalai District. Currently, this project operates in the following Taluks:

1. Tiruvannamalai Taluk
2. Chengam Taluk
3. Polur Taluk
4. Jamnamarathur Taluk
5. Kilpennathur Taluk
6. Thandrampattu Taluk
7. Kalasapakkam Taluk

The beneficiaries of this project are patients who require medical assistance for various health issues. Most of them come from poor socio-economic backgrounds and work as farmers or agricultural laborers. Detailed records of the beneficiaries, including their name, age, sex, and village, are maintained using pharmacy software. These records are regularly provided to the Drug Control Department for inspections.





Mobile Library

The beneficiaries of this project are students from Government schools in the following Taluks:

1. Tiruvannamalai Taluk
2. Kilpennathur Taluk
3. Chengam Taluk
4. Thandrampattu Taluk
5. Kalasapakkam Taluk

Students from Government middle and high schools are enrolled as members of the mobile library, with referrals made exclusively by the Headmasters of their respective schools. The project is fully digitized: a mobile application has been developed to track book issues to students, and a dashboard monitors reading patterns and resource management.





Evening Schools

The beneficiaries of this project are students from both Government and private schools, primarily from slums in villages and economically backward areas of Tiruvannamalai town. Currently, the students are from the following areas:

1. Adaiyur
2. Chinna Paliyapattu
3. Vedyappanur
4. Vengikkal
5. Pandithapattu
6. Ayothipattinam
7. Kilvanakkampadi
8. Periyeri

These students come from economically and socially disadvantaged families, with most of their parents working as low-income daily laborers. All student details are maintained in a regularly updated database, which is accessible to donors and government officials at any time.





Educational Sponsorship Program

The beneficiaries of this project are students from economically disadvantaged families. Their details are regularly maintained in a database, which is always accessible to donors and government officials. Currently, the students come from Tiruvannamalai Taluk, Chengam Taluk, and other nearby villages.



Environmental Projects

These activities are conducted in and around the Tiruvannamalai region, benefiting various Government departments. The project is fully implemented with local support. Firefighting efforts have been carried out in Tiruvannamalai and Kavuthi Hills.





Menstrual Hygiene Awareness

Menstrual Hygiene Project: This project is implemented in the District of Tiruvannamalai and now it is mainly implemented at the Government schools of the District.



Disaster Relief Project

Regenboog India Foundation plays an active role in providing immediate and compassionate disaster relief whenever natural calamities strike Tamil Nadu or Kerala. With a dedicated team on the ground, Regenboog swiftly mobilizes resources to distribute essential supplies such as food, clean water, clothing, and medical aid to affected communities. The foundation also works closely with local volunteers and authorities to ensure timely support and long-term recovery assistance for vulnerable families.
